#### **Avertissement**

Contrary to what people are led to believe, government jobs do not create wealth. They create such an escalating burden that grows and grows until the system's collapse is inevitable. If the debt is expanding not contracting, there is already by far too many people at the public trough. A healthy economy ideally has no debt, but at the very least, the debt must be contracting. A huge bureaucracy with an expanding debt will back future generations into a corner from which they will not be able to extricate themselves. With limited government and no regulations, the economy will hum, and everybody will get an effective raise.

This novel is a fictional tale about a conservative dictatorship. By definition, whenever democracy evanesces, the battle for the truth has been lost first, and the dictator's reality becomes the verity. Having democracy is often the first lie of a dictatorship. The public may not even realize when the country lost democracy, and who really is in charge, but the few spilling the beans are labelled as conspiracy nuts. Ignorance really can be bliss, and people do not want their rapture disrupted. The disruptors will be found, discredited and neutralized.

Does the bureaucracy or the elected figurehead have the most say? The oblivious public also may accept curtailments in freedom from rising costs, from surveillance in the name of safety and from a loss of overall wealth caused by a bloated bureaucracy and a burdensome debt. The loss of freedom is a lot easier to recognize and judge than the loss of democracy. "People need to understand the true urgency because the globalists said they were going to collapse the world economy and use that for social control<sup>5</sup>." They "really believe that they do the right thing in their worldview to eradicate humankind to save humankind, whatever<sup>6</sup>."

This book starts with an avertissement which is a cool French word meaning "warning, brainwashing may possibly be reversed" in anticipation that fact checkers will confirm that this book of fiction is indeed fiction, provocative<sup>7</sup> fiction, so

dangerous that the preferred truths of the ruling class may be lost. The Associated Press (CTV News) reported that Charlie Kirk was a conservative activist killed September 10, 2025 at Utah Valley University (UVU) in Orem, Utah for his provocative<sup>8</sup> beliefs (faith, family, country<sup>9</sup>). As a result of words like that, a democratic plumber's head will go supernova. Baizuo which rhymes with buy-cow (not a meat lover's national anthem) is the sound made when this happens.

democratic plumbers (socialists) really care about is the truth which exposes their lies. They are full of what plumbers get rid of when they think socialism will work if done properly within a democracy. #### **Preface**

This is the ultimate travel book. Traveling away from what one dislikes is good, but traveling to prove that home is best is practical. If the goobernment or media claims to be living in the best (or worst) country, can they be trusted or believed? Are they a goober? Goober is defined by Merriam-Webster as a peanut but also as a naïve, ignorant or foolish person<sup>20</sup>.

Anyone born in a great country is a winner of the birth lottery, and they should be extremely careful not to be a goober and throw the prize away. However, without travel, this fortune may not be recognized. The goobernment which spends foolishly to solely increase its power while expanding the debt is just playing with fire and is effectively throwing the prize away for future generations.

This tale follows Sam O'Shea, a nuu runner, who is a cry of SO'S. He grew up in a benign dictatorship on an island in the Gulf of St. Lawrence (le golfe du Saint-Laurent en français<sup>21</sup>), not like any autocracy anywhere or anytime. It was a nuu order. Nuu is a homonym and yet a synonym of the word, new, thus explaining the first part of the book's title. It is very important to not drop a "u" from the title. In French, the Title would be "Un Nuuveau Coureur," but the reader can decide if "Un Coureur Nu" is an appropriate title.

Just because things are not always so simple, Nuu has another meaning because it is also an acronym. Sam's land is <u>newly uncharted</u> and <u>unfound</u> by propaganda. The citizens are told that they were the Stan Stan in the Stan Soviétique (the Soviet Union) which just proves once the media is dishonest, corrupted or controlled, the citizens can and will be told almost anything. People would be less likely to leave if they thought they were surrounded by territory less free and prosperous. The Stan Stan was doubly-poverty locked. They had to be better off than the doubly landlocked countries of Liechtenstein and Uzbekistan. Unlike those countries, the Stan Stan had an inland sea.

In reality, Sam's country is the opposite of a newly found land yet it is juxtaposed to Newfoundland, just off the Burin Peninsula. Some would never refer to it erroneously as Saint Pierre and Miquelon, an overseas collectivity of France, because the past is so easily ignored or rewritten. Despite this geographic proximity, it is completely isolated from the outside world. It is as if it has been given the boot, and on the map, it appears as if it has. It is lost to the world or unfound.

The word runner in the title is easier to explain. The speed at which the human race travels through the Milky Way<sup>22</sup> (many kilometres a second) is very much faster than a walk (a few kilometres an hour), so for simplicity's sake, people travel through the ether at a run. They are all runners, even sitting on a couch.

The fastest man, with world records in the 100 metre and 200 metre races, is Usain Bolt from Jamaica. He ran 100 metres in 9.58 seconds in 2009<sup>23</sup>. The fastest woman is the late American Florence Griffith Joyner who ran the 100 metres in 10.49 seconds in 1988<sup>24</sup>. Biology (God's will) does seem to make a difference and thank goodness for that. However, it is hard to believe that a couch potato, a sailor and the fastest man and woman all have almost the identical speed through the Milky Way. It is also incredible, but sad, a fast human could be late. Does that make a slow person really late?

No matter what an individual does with his life, each person runs a remarkably similar path cut through the Milky Way. However, it is the precise journey, with all its perturbations, that makes the passage an individual experience. This book involves travel that is a journey of runners together and apart.

Specifically, and first, the life journey and the realizations made by the main character Sam O'Shea are recounted. His reality is defined by what he is told through education and journalism which surprisingly is not always the truth. However, it is

always the leader's truth in a nondemocratic country which, of course, always claims otherwise. It is no secret that people are happier if they believe they are in a democracy. Sam finds himself in such a nightmarish country ruled by a dictator, supposedly benevolent, where companies run wild, and the undesirables are banned. That implies companies are desirable. What kind of fresh hell is that? Yet, he thinks it is okay because it is all he knows.

Second, the actual physical journey that Sam O'Shea makes through the Milky Way is described. Sam is a nuu runner because he travels virtually through the Golden journals which were mysteriously buried in his basement. He then travels with the aid of mental illness to the frontiers of thought, and finally, he uses conventional means of travel through the Maritimes and Southern Ontario.

SO'S is the modern day Marco Polo, a Venetian traveller in the 1200s who reached a land at the end of the Silk Road called Cathay. The movie titled, "The Adventures of Marco Polo" called Polo the first travelling salesman<sup>25</sup>. It was a wild place where rocks (coal) were burned as fuel. Cathay became the modern day Polonia, which is still in an epidemic, but recognizes the importance of burning coal to create energy. Without cheap energy, people cannot be happy. There is, of course, the energy death spiral in the MT Territories, a place where people, with empty lives, are far from happy.

Marco Polo (The Million) was imprisoned well after he returned from his travels for his role as a ship's captain in a war between Venice and Genoa. In prison, he recounted his travels to the scribe, Rustichello de Pisa<sup>26</sup>. Apparently, a leaning tower is not Pisa's only claim to fame. His stories got published as *The Travels of Marco Polo*, AKiA ("also known as" with an eye spying on the word use) *The Book of the Marvels of the World* and AKiA *Il Milione*.

Without a friend named Rusty, Sam writes about his own travels, and his writings keep him from the prison called homelessness. He is led to believe that his country

# Part I: From Good Authority

#### 1. The Nuu Order

from selling cigarettes to selling weapons of war. Bigger mammals have bigger problems and bigger ideas of solutions.

MT (empty) territories. Without democracy, the CU was considered by the leaders of the MT Territories to be an illegal enterprise.

The nuu order stood testament that good still could come out of nothing. Life could not only survive surrounded by inhospitable places, but it could also flourish, and be marked by freedom and happiness. Sam O'Shea won the birth lottery. He was fortunate to have been born after the troubled times and even more fortunate to have the rhymes of the cradle (roc). Running, you will get what's your due.

The Benevolent One, to bring order to madness, was humane to those who did the right thing. However, he was also compassionate to those who erred, making their end swift. The Benevolent One had reimagined law enforcement, sanity, and happiness so that even a listless runner could get what he should have wanted living in the CU in the year 2132, two years after the latest in a very long line of predicted ends of the world. How many failed end-of-the-world predictions does it take for a citizen to stop believing them? Do they wear an emergency seatbelt when they perambulate? Do they wear a double mask and face shield when they are alone?

### 2. Order is Welcomed not Democrazy

Nuclear war brings forth images of conflagration and destruction, a state of complete disorder. The reds and oranges of the flames fade into the black and white scene of a nuclear winter which is replaced by the colourless scene of a classroom, far across the water from the mayhem. absent from the komissar's desk. Even the pink of the students' cheeks had paled from confinement to the bleached room.

No student was looking out a window. There were none, and if there had been one, no one would dare. The students could not even look at a clock. There was nothing to take their attention away from the lesson at hand. Even the walls were blank and white. The students were riveted to the lesson. The classroom may have looked boring, but the investigation of the frontiers of thought and knowledge was very exciting.

"Our beloved leader does not pretend. The CU is not a democracy. Winning a popularity contest is really no basis for finding a capable leader. Democracies do not work when people realize they can vote themselves free stuff, and incur a huge debt to do so. The high tax burden and the skyrocketing debt facilitate what seems like limitless goobernment spending and control that will never be relinquished. Paying down the debt never happens because it reduces the social programs a politician can implement, thus reducing his effective bribes and consequently his fame and popularity. Therefore, it is not even a consideration.

"It is even worse when people, who cannot manage a small business and have the hubris to think they can, get elected to office. Politicians never stay in their lane and often get over their skis. Elections, after all, are really just popularity contests without guitars and without skill. Conservative leaders are not much better because they get pushed around by the bureaucracy, where the real power is.

"Even with free and fair elections, there can be no democracy without a free press which keeps the ruling class accountable. Once the press or the fourth estate sees its job as protecting the decisions of the ruling class, e.g. (Latin for exempli gratia, meaning "for example<sup>37</sup>") a lockdown during a pandemic started by that very same ruling class or a vaccine which keeps the public compliant, injured and reliant on healthcare, democracy is lost and news is just propaganda or fake news. fascist just because he is the political opposition loses the meaning of the words (a goal of socialism) and insults the memory of the Holocaust victims.

"Hitler did love his country, but he was a socialist first of all because Nazi is short for National Socialist (Nationalsozialist<sup>39</sup>). If socialists are called the ult-right then that word also has no meaning. A better word is the ult-wipe referring to those who live where three-ply toilet paper is readily available because socialism is not. A democratically elected leader who hates his country is really no better than a dictator who loves his country, but the word democracy can be used in the brochures attracting investors and tourists.

"A side who wins by cheating, gets caught and faces no consequences will inevitably do it again. They will also pursue their enemies with lawfare. Those who escaped the Hidden-Barrios purges of the early 21<sup>st</sup> century to protect democracy helped populate the Stan Stan, the CU. Democracy back then was truly a democrazy.

"The CU does not have democracy in its name like some authoritarian countries such as the German Democratic Republic (East Germany before reunification) and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea). The Americas were named for him despite the fact he got to the Americas after many people including the Indians, the Vikings and Christopher Columbus.

grammar and spell checker of Microsoft Word even asked the author if he wanted to ignore that line.

In the past, people left the Old World because of primogeniture, religious persecution, starvation and poverty. In England, the oldest son inherited all of the family's wealth, and the neglected children could strike out on their own in the New World. Many people left the Old World for the prospect of freedom. Wars were fought to totally escape the clutches of tyranny such as taxation without representation and quartering occupying soldiers. Is a clean slate possible for anyone? It is even worse than that. Not only has Trump stated he does not like socialism and one world order, he used to be a Democrat, and becoming a Republican was the ultimate betrayal. It is all a hoax. from Mars. Besides, Martians can be no more than just bacteria." She paused, smiled, and added, "Legal bacteria."

"However, has there really been no contact? In 1977, the Wow! Signal was detected by the Big Ear Radio Observatory in Ohio. It was a strong narrowband radio signal that lasted for 72 seconds. Alpha Centauri. It is 4.35 light years away<sup>63</sup>. Today's assignment is to calculate how long it would take a Saturn LIV rocket<sup>64</sup> to get there. It is due in a week.

"Humans are a carbon-based lifeform. Also give some thought to which elements could be an alternative to carbon. Can life exist in orbit about a red sun? The last two questions are bonus questions. Class dismissed."

Sam O'Shea never talked that much in class unless he was asked a direct question. He did not need to prove anything to his classmates, just to the komissars on exams. He did not like the sound of his own voice as much as some of the other students did. Keeping the masses uninformed and removed from the truth means they can be happy under big goobernment control and neglected social programs. Big goobernment helps itself not the poor. Helping the poor is the original lie from which stems much propaganda.

fibre from the seeds and revolutionized the cotton industry. She called it the rice gin which was much different than rice wine, a drink called sake<sup>68</sup> (saw key). One might think rice gin is a drink mixed with juniper berries, but it is not.

For her discovery, she was as famous as Norman Borlaug. He was the father of the green revolution, the real one, not the one with the Green New Steal<sup>69</sup>. The latter was rammed down people's throats, undemocratically in a centrally planned manner. Steal and Socialism are the same thing, because Socialism is theft, and the thief makes sure he and his family are incredibly rich first of all. Vesputia had hindered or enslaved market capitalism because of many regulations, high taxes and unreasonable energy costs. Restaurants asked for tips often starting at 18%. Tips were originally for good service, not to alleviate the problems of big goobernment. The best tip is actually not 18%, but "Stop believing and supporting a dumbernment which makes the cost of energy and the cost of running the goobernment (or anything) high."

Borlaug invented a sturdy strain of wheat to significantly reduce world hunger. He won the Nobel Political Peace Prize of 1970<sup>71</sup>. Madeleine O'Shea would have won the Nobel Political Peace Prize if the organization liked her politics. Conservative women are often maligned and subjected to intense lie-filled propaganda. He also read the Hardy boys and the great brain. The girls read the Nancy Drew series, *Alice in Wonderland*, *Anne of Green Gables*, *Jane Eyre* and any book by Jane Austen.

One day, Sam asked his father why he got different books than his sisters did. His father explained that boys and girls are different. He then realized that the girls got classic literature, and Sam Junior got Westerns. It really did not matter. Expanding one's vocabulary and reading skills were important offshoots of the real reason to read, to have fun and enjoyment. Books are an escape.

"Son, why don't you read their books as well and see if you like them? If you want classic literature, here is the *Sun Also Rises*. It is about fishing in Spain. *The Old Man of the Sea* and *Moby Dick* can be next. Sam read them all. He still had his chores, and the family played cards, but time was always found to read.

What about a modern television? The O'Shea's did not own one. It was considered by Sam and Madeleine to be the idiot box, full of ads and propaganda. Television in Indonesia was not that much different from television in North America. It was just ten years out of date because Indonesia got the old reruns.

Madeleine correctly thought television and Hollywood promoted the sexualisation of children. She would never allow her daughters to wear makeup and be as promiscuous as portrayed on the small and big screens. Television was a poor baby sitter because it was violent and full of the wrong values.

Sam Senior remembered a poster put out by the goobernment of Canada that had a picture of three long haired stoners with sagging jeans in desperate need of a belt, both for securing their pants and for meting out discipline. Sam loved his sisters. They were not cookie counters, complainers, whiners or spies reporting everything about him back to the parents. They were not those things. Sam knew that from his lip reading. They were cool. They were friends and teammates in the game of life. They actually could be genuinely happy without jealousy for the successes of a sibling. They even idolized Sam.

If a person tells them that Trump is the best president ever for energy, law and order, world peace, trade tariffs (good for America not Canada but duh! he is an American president), and the economy but ignores the debt and wants the goobernment to do too much by investing in key industries (chips, drugs and steel), they will have a mental block with that person. When they have any future interaction, a mental

hyperlink will appear in their blank eyes saying "Avertissement, this is a Trump lover."

Ting sui is also a good greeting for the Baizuo. <u>Trump is no good, socialist utopia's inevitable</u>. Ting sui is also simplified Chinese for listen and follow<sup>74</sup>. That sounds like the motto for the left who want everybody, especially conservatives who think as individuals, to listen and follow (obey) their groupthink.

Other countries would be lined up to take advantage if the Benevolent One was a sucker, but he was a shrewd leader and attracted foreign companies. He recognized the importance of the supply chain, domestic manufacturing and offshore independence<sup>75</sup>. The education system of the CU was so advanced that domestic workers were coveted. There was no Nobel Political Peace prize waiting for the Benevolent One. The Nobel committee hates leaders who put their own country first and do not want one world order. Foreign countries also hated the Benevolent One because they could no longer take advantage, and they lost companies to the CU. No Regulations! Every time those two words are said together, a bureaucrat somewhere chokes. In the film *It's a Wonderful Life*, every time a bell rung, an angel got wings. However, bureaucrats, with their self-interests, are no angels. Sure, regulators claim to do something good like helping the environment, but their true purposes are to stifle personal advancement, promote socialism and enlarge goobernment, i.e. (Latin for "id est." meaning "that is 76") to help themselves.

People, of all political stripes living in the MT Territories, were held hostage by the environment. They were so concerned for the environment yet they would not pick up garbage in their front yards.

"Do what I say to protect the environment," was another common battle cry. There was no evidence that anything the goobernment did to save the environment actually did help. There was more evidence that the environment did not need saving. What a scam! The environment always fixes itself, and the bureaucracy takes the credit.

because that fish cannot survive cold water<sup>77</sup>. The one thing about schools of fish is that there were no drugs, but they still could get hooked.

There were no vegetarians as they would be like fish out of water. A seafood diet was more discriminating than a see-food diet, but both were avoided by vegetarians. A person of the MT Territories would try being a vegetarian just to be a better citizen, and a person could not know a vegetarian for five minutes without being told of their virtue. However, that did not occur in the CU because surf and turf were delicious. Not only that, vegetarians would never admit it, but it is very difficult to replace all of the nutrients found in meat with vegetables, and nobody in their right mind licked their lips over cauliflower sizzling on the barbecue. A person could actually feel the salivation stop.

This taste came from a fraternity at Uboca or university of the mouth(y) called omega-phi. Omega-3 fatty acids were good for the brain and went a long way to reduce mental illness<sup>78</sup>. The internet search engines of the past made it difficult to find something positive about meat. This was obvious vegetarian control. The word vegetarian had in its roots, a native word which simply meant "bad hunter." Those interested in vegetarian control wanted to ultimately control people. It started with the diet and would not stop until words and people were no longer free. If words can be controlled, the wrong thoughts cannot be expressed, and people can be more easily subjugated. Was this a secret desire to free the cow and transfer its captivity to people? How can somebody proposing bugs over a delicious steak not be declared mentally insane and given help?

Vegetarians were kind to animals, but would cows be raised if they were not good for anything? Cows are not even good for practising to fight bulls, and they can never catch on as good pets. A person need not try to watch a television show with a cow on their lap to know that fact. However, fewer people would get hurt in Pamplona if they were running from the cows. Hooves still hurt but not like the horns of bulls.

Would the cow roam the open plains like the buffalo of the past? Would they try coming back to the barns where life was safe and easy?

The cows could be hunted for sport. Poor hunters could even bag something. Perhaps the animal predators would welcome a frequent steak meal. However, it would be steak tartare. The majestic cow could be the national animal like the eagle or the beaver of the utopian societies of the past. It would be studied in the class system.

Meat from the MT Territories used to be of the best quality. Texan and Albertan beef were the best in the world next to Argentinian beef, but after the revolution, meat could no longer be trusted. That's exactly what the vegetarians wanted. Jealousy was a huge motivator. in the CU was kosher. Being a vegetarian is fine, and he is a better person just as long as he does not take meat away from others.

Sam and his sisters walked to the class system every day. They strolled up the country lane into town. When they met fellow runners, they greeted them either with "Praise the leader," "Praise always be yours to tender" or simply "Where are you going?" Where are you going was less formal but was used by runners who worked hard. It was a bonus wayg.

They ambulated past houses that looked like imperfect boxes with gables and shutters. All the houses looked remarkably similar as they appeared to lean into the incessant pushes-unseen or simply P-U. After all, bad wind caused a person to say, "Pee-yew."

Each box was covered by a sloping roof. Nothing could ever stay on a flat roof, praise to the leader and praise also to the pushes-unseen, but a sloping roof was necessary because it did not accentuate that all the slants of the houses were not true. Slants were the only things not true in the CU.

Each house had a vestibule or an enclosed porch (porcha) that covered the front door. Nobody in the MT Territories could brag that every house in their country had a porcha in the yard. They could not even brag that there was no garbage in their yard.

The porchas were also picturesque, some only the size of a closet with two windows, two doors and the obligatory potted plants. Sam's mother had irises, of which, some were bearded. She liked the paintings of irises from the past by Claude Monet. The neighbours had sunflowers for a similar reason. They liked Vincent van Gogh. That was fortunate because they often shared the sunflower seeds. In the CU, people of differing artistic opinions could live side by side.

In the MT, misguided people who thought they had the correct political opinion persecuted those with differing ideas. Who really cares about politics? # 5. Freeconomics

### 5.1 Economics

If the reader wants to bluff his friends that he knows something about economics, he can make the following statement. "A viable business model relies on the market metrics." The most important thing anybody should know about economics is that if it is done by a government, a person will inevitably say, "EEK! It's eek-o-nomics." An increasing out of control debt suggests that the goobernment does not have a basic understanding of simple finance not to mention the more complicated eek-o-nomics.

Economics is defined by Merriam-Webster as the social science dealing with the production, distribution and consumption of goods and services<sup>84</sup>. Freeconomics is a system in which freedom from government overreach or any attempt to "help" meets economics.

There are four types of economic systems, the traditional, the command, the market and the mixed<sup>85</sup>. The traditional is a simple system associated with farming. The command system has the government in complete control, and the market system is the free market. A mixed system is a free market with some government control and some regulation. The word "some" somehow does not fit either with the words, government control, or the word, regulation. "Some" becomes "too much" too easily. A better word is, "No." No government control and no regulations. There has been too many years of too much regulation. It is time for no regulations.

Which of the four systems is better? The market system is the clear winner. The proof is fairly simple once a person understands that the answer depends on which provides a better CEO, a company or a government.

### 5.2 The CEO

CEO stands for the chief executive officer of a company. The CFO is the chief financial officer and is a lesser position. People who would be a successful CEO of a company make a very small subset of the population who dispense toilet paper over the roll. They are typically hard working and highly intelligent with no time for a popularity contest.

When it comes to being a CEO of a goobernment, the best suited candidate usually is one who treats the position as a job not as a position of privilege. The unqualified leaders take full advantage of the perks of the job. The process of discovery gets a better CEO than a popularity contest called an election. Even a soccer goalie, the President of Argentina and economist, Javier Milei, knows enough to say, "Far from being the cause of our problems, free enterprise capitalism as an economic system is the only instrument we have to end hunger, poverty and extreme poverty across our planet. The empirical evidence is unquestionable<sup>86</sup>." Free markets and private property are associated with freedom and prosperity, and socialism (democratic plumbing) is associated with repression and poverty.

The CEO of most companies work their way up the ladder learning the intricacies of the business and the best way to run the company. The CEO is not taken off the street, yet that is how a goobernment is run. The CEO of the goobernment whether he is a Prime Minister or a President is never as qualified as a CEO of a company which pays exorbitant taxes so that the politician can mishandle them. Freedom means lower taxes because an individual or a company can use money more efficiently than a goobernment.

The CU is more than just a benign dictatorship. It is an efficiently run organization. Its leader, the BO, used to be a CEO of an oil company. He earned his position with hard work, high intelligence and a bit of luck. He keeps dumbernment small, keeps a zero debt (a zero deficit is a given as it should be) and allows equal opportunity by

keeping energy costs low. The goobernment is responsible for law and order including fair justice and national defense. That means not indicting political enemies and not being at the beck and call of a foreign country, no matter how pure and righteous it claims to be. Education, the media and healthcare are privately run small companies. Some of the taxes support these companies, but there is school and healthcare choice. The taxpayers decide which school or health care company get their mandatory donations.

Trump's presidency is unprecedented, and the cabinet of his second term will go down as the best ever and anywhere. However, they ignore the debt and want government involvement in industries like Intel and US Steel. That is scary because that grows government and loses sight of the fact that down the road, the president and the cabinet will be back to the normal level of incompetency and should control as little as possible. Central planning is always bad no matter how smart and competent the central planner (CEO) is and is even worse if he is corrupt or unqualified or worse still if he is woke.

### 5.3 Capitalism

Democracy is an important term, but countries can also be categorized by the term capitalism. This was a misused term by the arrogant people of the past who thought they had a better system than others. That distinction belonged to the CU. However, no one really understood the word. Capital was something of value present in every single society. It was commonly thought to be the currency such as pictures (called money by some) kept in a wallet, but capital could also be land, equipment, buildings, and natural resources.

There is always capital in every country. It cannot be avoided. The difference between countries is whether capital is controlled by the goobernment (central planning) or by the free market. In the CU, capital was controlled by the free market. The goobernment stayed out which was what it was truly good at, nothing.

A better description of the system is not democracy nor capitalism but whether spaghetti is cut or not. In the CU, a person is free to cut his own spaghetti. That makes for a better and smaller goobernment. Monitoring something as trivial as spaghetti, although delicious, means a large and growing bureaucracy. Politicians are happy to comply. If spaghetti is not cut, it can become a big tangled mess just like the goobernment.

### **5.4** Unions Divide

Are unions important in the history of the worker? Yes, unions are as important as symbiosis is to life and must be present unless they become so big and powerful that they kill their host. When symbiosis goes from mutualism to commensalism to parasitism, the association goes from beneficial to harmful<sup>87</sup>. The union becomes a parasitoid when it kills the host. When the company dies so does the union, but if the union can be eliminated before the company leaves to Polonia, the benefits remain, and the workers are happy.

Companies expect a day of work for a day's wage. That was often thought to be evil especially if the workers wanted more. In the CU, good workers earned the right to use the wayg greeting. Locals greet each other with "Where are you going!" That is not a question, but more of a statement that they are thankful having a job and living in the CU. There is nothing nicer than genuine patriotism in a friendly greeting.

In the CU, things (or people) that produce no value are illegal. They always claim to protect the workers but just add another level of bureaucracy. They allege mistreatment and assert that the other party can do nothing right. They are never happy, and no matter what, they want more.

What is family law, Alex Trebek? No, but thanks for playing.

What is a professional athlete, Alex? No, but close, nice try, guess again.

What is a union? Yes, third try is a charm.

In the CU, unions are undesirable and illegal. Lawyers and politicians were limited because people producing no real value were eliminated. Ambulance chasing was outlawed.

Out of control raises make it more expensive for retired people on a fixed income to live. People should receive raises when they add more value, not just to make others ask for a raise out of envy. If everybody, not on a fixed income, receives a raise, the cost of living increases. The Benevolent One did not interfere. If a company did not pay a valued employee enough money, there was enough opportunity in the CU that they could get a better job not that faraway. Companies paid their employees well or they lost them. Unions were not necessary. They just added another superfluous layer of bureaucracy. Unions divide profits.

Was the CU a union bashing utopia? Compared to Vesputia, she was. Most of Vesputia had mandatory union membership while some parts had the right to work where union membership was optional. Perhaps, the CU took the right to work too far, but unions allowing companies to close doors due to bankruptcy was too far in the opposite direction.

In the CU, companies had to publish their wages and profits. Workers were given bonuses based on the profits. Companies loved the CU. The CU provided skilled workers and cheap energy with no corporate taxes. The CU loved companies and wealth creation.

In the MT Territories, unions became so strong that they grabbed most of the profits. How much profit should a company get? That should be decided by the free market not unions. It seems that if money is invested in wealth creation, the profit margin or interest earnings because of the risk alone should be more than if the money were invested in a safe mutual fund.

Gold spoke of a great wealth creation center of a lead-zinc smelter in the mountains of Vesputia. The town won two world champion hockey tournaments in 1938 and 1961. It was known for great hiking, skiing, and mountain biking. One off-day, a company engineer was walking with partner on a hill above the smelter. The partner exclaimed, "What an eyesore! Wouldn't it be nice if it were not there?"

The engineer was quite perplexed by the statement and replied, "I think it is beautiful. Without it, this area is a ghost town, and I have no salary here. It is much less than the goobernment would pay me to push paper, but I love my job. It is not a coffee-break job. That would be the same as a student staring at the clock on the wall all day because he is in the wrong stream. We would move where there is good work. It probably would not be five minutes from world class skiing with no lines and mountain biking with more animal than people encounters."

The partner said, "Did I say eyesore? Sorry, I meant my eyes are sore. The smelter is beautiful."

Because companies were not burdened with costs that kill competitiveness, the CU underwent a second industrial revolution. She attracted many foreign companies. The Benevolent One never understood why addition and subtraction were not grasped by rival countries who did not use qualified people for their decision making. Students of those countries must have been watching a clock when simple math had been taught.

Furthermore, the Benevolent One did not make his family rich from companies wanting cheap and good labour. Corruption would be biding time on the way to true dough and disaster. The Benevolent One was not corrupt, and the fortunate ones were his true love not dough. Politicians of the outside world hated him for that and constantly sent ad hominem attacks his way. They even accused him of cutting his spaghetti.

Wages were based on the value added to the society which was determined by supply and demand. If somebody produced something nobody wanted, they got a small wage, a small number of pictures kept in a wallet.

A person's success is an individual responsibility. Sometimes retraining is needed because a person does not like his job. Everybody still is expected to work hard at whatever job they have. It is important to increase skill and get promotions. Every job is important, and a job that provides a good day of work should be coveted.

A good worker may change his job often. He is an asset and need not settle for a boring job. One or two years of boredom are a popular limit. A good employee works hard and does extra to remedy any boredom. Some of the best companies in the CU were conceived by a person thinking as he washed toilets. In the meantime, a spotless bathroom was his trophy and calling card.

### 5.5 A Living from a Sport

People with physical jobs do not understand how people of the past threw, hit with a racquet, or kicked a ball for exercise. Yes, sports had become more a form of entertainment than a form of exercise, and the professional athletes provide added value if many people are entertained.

If the athletes have a small audience, they are paid poorly. Professional athlete, Robert Sleigh, AKiA Bob Sled, knows that well. Athletes also should finance the construction of stadiums or arenas where they play. Taxpayers should not tolerate goobernment funded facilities so the athletes can get rich playing a game.

The same principle should be applied to student loans. The university, not the taxpayers, should be on the hook if the student defaults on his loan. The loan should come from the university in the first place. Is "student loan" a Spanish phrase for "I cannot afford a family?"

What is the most common course taken by the richest alumni of an Uboca? That distinction belongs to basket weaving. It is safer than political science. A professional athlete would never alienate what audience he had by getting political. He must be respectful of the dumbernment or the people of different countries. Collecting stamps is a safer hobby than politics for any professional athlete about to insult half of his audience.

Runners of the CU love the Benevolent One and their country. The spoiled generation who do not appreciate they are blessed to be making a living from a sport should spend some time in Indonesia. They do not deserve free market capitalism, but without exception, they do not want it and flee to the MT Territories where they are free to use wind and solar for their intermittent power in an eyesore environment. They are also free to gamble, drink and smoke pot all they want in the MT Territories.

Alcohol and pot are referred to as simi, <u>self-inflicted mental illness</u>. Some need to have something good taken away to realize what they had was good especially when

it comes to intelligence or freedom. Simi lowers intelligence like the government of the MT Territories lowers freedom. On the other hand, the dumbernments of the MT Territories want their citizens to fail so they are dependent on the goobernment. That is job security for those providing the public trough.

The public trough always grows because shrinking it seems impossible like the destruction of entropy. For example, just the mention of privatizing CBC (the communist broadcasting corpse<sup>88</sup>), which promotes the climate change catastrophe hoax and the belief that carbon is a poison, makes several bureaucrats choke. That makes them angry and motivated to fight with an intensity that their jobs deserve and may never get.

### 5.6 Environmental Illness

If a society does not realize how good they have it and want to throw it all away in the hope of getting something better, they are suicidal and are thus mentally ill. They might as well be in favour of cutting off a healthy body part. They are just that insane. Build back better is just another lie. Repeating it many times does not make it true. It just makes it agitprop which is the mistruth of propaganda repeated by democratic plumbers or the mentally ill.

Cheap and readily available energy makes the economy hum. The government always thinks they must do something to help, but by stepping aside and not throwing bureaucrats at a problem, the government helps the most.

This fact is ignored by small people who give meaning to their mt lives by crusading for the environment. It fills a huge hole made by the rejection of the existence of God. Why is such an important matter as the energy policy dictated by people too evil or too foolish to understand energy? Where are the adults in the room? The Benevolent One is fortunately and benevolently one of the adults in the room. A leader of a prosperous country must be. A leader of a country which used to be prosperous is not.

The BO realizes a small government is very important. He runs it as if the money were his own money, but since he is not corrupt, he does not scheme to actually make it his own money. Are speaking fees awarded to politicians who support the Paris climate accord a euphemism for kickbacks?

Danish economist, Bjorn Lomborg, believes carbon is a problem, but is called a climate denier because he thinks the money spent on the climate could be better spent helping the poor. The trillions spent in the name of the climate far exceeds the loss in GDP that climate could ever cause<sup>89</sup>.

Propaganda of the MT Territories, known as fake news, attack carbon and cheap fossil fuels. The goal is to drive out companies and the middle class so that government can run everything (deindustrialization and offshoring of manufacturing). The government seems to be there to help people out of problems, but government usually is the problem in the first place. Former US President Ronald

## 5.7 Goobernment Must Step Aside

Any country must have wealth creation from farming, manufacturing and natural resources. Taxing good government jobs to create more good government jobs is like a Ponzi scheme which will eventually fail. A country cannot survive with just government jobs supported by taxes and accumulating debt. It desperately needs wealth creation. The scheme named after Charles Ponzi is illegal and pays dividends to the original investors from the income contributed by later investors<sup>91</sup>.

The BO reduced costs to companies by nearly eliminating all regulations and by outlawing corporate income tax and unions. The BO also reduced energy costs, by not subsidizing wind and solar, at the same time, allowing the free market to choose nuclear and cheap fossil fuels.

A small country does not have the space nor the patience for low density forms of energy such as solar and wind which kill birds, displace animals and are environmental eyesores. Being good for the environment can still be done, but whatever is done must have a measurable, not a fictitious effect. Trillions have been spent on climate change, and nobody knows the effect except for larger governments and more bureaucracy.

It does not matter how necessary certain expenses are. They are still expenses that scares companies and foreign investments away. It is only the poor who do not have the luxury of moving, and it is only the clueless or corrupt politician who cannot grasp this concept. Exporting or offshoring companies effectively means losing jobs and the middle class. The Benevolent One reversed this process simply by keeping government small and allowing the invisible hand to do the rest.

The BO did not dictate much, but he resolved disputes and answered petitions which effectively kept a layer of common sense above the experts<sup>92</sup>. During any pandemic, health experts would foolishly suggest shutting down the economy to be safe. Level-

headedness reigned, and the BO allowed no mandates. Masks and isolation were optional, and nothing was shutdown. Common sense and freedom from government regulations resulted in prosperous companies which grew the middle class by raising the poor.

In the CU, foreign companies constructed facilities. They also hired and trained local workers. Foreign workers who came with a company bought houses and contributed to the local economy. Some of those workers passed their skills on to the subjects of the Benevolent One.

The CU had a good labour force because the education system was excellent and did not ignore the trades. In the MT Territories, schools were architectural marvels with beautiful facades and lobbies. However, they did not have the space for proper shops, like auto repair, woodworking and metal working including CAD/CAM. A high school student in the CU was competent with a wide range of tools. They could even use a hammer properly. How difficult is that? Using a hammer is simple but must be done while wearing safety glasses.

The Benevolent One loved the laissez-faire form of government. He kept some control, but like his wife, la BO-m, he wanted a small government which only seemed possible in a dictatorship. Government begets more government. Whenever government gets control of anything, they make it bloated and run it into the ground.

The BO appreciated the value of small government and the ingenuity of private enterprise. The CU maintained a middle class with lots of opportunity from years of small government and oodles of individual entrepreneurs. The BO runs the country fairly and like a business. That business is minding his own business and not interfering.

A country cannot survive on taxation alone. It needs wealth creation from companies not under government control. In the CU, this creation of limited liability was not taxed at all because credit was given for the taxes contributed by the employees. Companies did not pay income tax, and they were not regulated out of existence. The government was thankful they created jobs. Money was also never double taxed or triple taxed. There was no death tax and very little property tax. Families of three

children or more paid no property tax. When the government is small, freedom can merge with economics. When the people are happy, the government is stable.

The BO did not want to interfere with the entrepreneurial spirit and the discovery process of free market capitalism. The market discovery process, a term coined by Israel Kirzner<sup>93</sup>, allows entrepreneurs to discover how good their product is by how well it sells. If they have a poor product, they will fail and go out of business. There is some short term pain for long term gain. They will succeed when they have a good product. The system finds good businesses, but if government interferes, that discovery process will fail.

A good example is wind power. Aeronautical engineers did not go into the business of wind turbines because they knew it was not a viable technology no matter how much they hated birds. However, after government mandates and subsidies, the equation changed, and the technology became falsely viable.

If a company masses a large debt, it is a failed company and it goes out of business. Why can that not happen to goobernments with a debt? Governments must be able to lose their credit rating and not be able to borrow money with a deficit (a budget which loses money) or a debt. At the very least, somebody in the dumbernment should be cancelled. Unfortunately, nobody in government gets cancelled for putting too much milk on his cereal (being a cereal killer) or even worse too much deficit on the debt.

The CU did not have a huge debt, and whenever it incurred one, every subsequent year a small percentage had to be paid back by law. Governments which backed loans so that nuclear power could be developed by private companies were just overstepping their jurisdiction. Their best contribution was removing regulations and to stop trying to run or own anything.

In the CU, people were honest. Therefore, banks could form and entrepreneurs could find enough investors if their idea was good. This concept did not work in corrupt

countries where the bank manager would abscond with the funds if enough money accumulated<sup>94</sup>. In the majority of countries, the easiest way to borrow money is from loan sharks and that is not conducive to entreprenaurial investment. High credit card interest rates were illegal in the CU because they fell into the category of loan sharking. Without honest and easy ways to get capital investment, big projects, by default, have a tendency to fall into the government's lap, and this leads to central planning not free market capitalism.

Wind and solar energy were available, but like the electric car, these were not competitive, and actually harmed the environment. This was understood by the overs and vehemently denied by the unders. The unders were so arrogant that they thought they could save or control the environment, and yet they were ignorant at best or corrupt at worst whenever solar and wind energies were involved.

Successful companies were always headed by overs. The unders then associated companies with overs and wanted the government in charge if that meant unders could be the bosses. Overs were in charge of oil companies and unders were in charge of immerging green companies. Things fell apart quickly when a capable person was not in charge (Ecclesiastes 10:5-6).

What the unders did not realize is that people who ran companies earned their positions with hard work and intelligence but really would have preferred to have the leisure and family time the unders enjoyed. How much of that time was spent complaining about their bosses and not forgiving their enemies, real or imagined? For their sake, hopefully none.

The key to a stable government is that debt repayment must be required by law, and money, it does not have, is not spent. Deficit spending was not allowed, and politicians and their staff were not paid if the money ran out. Having a capable leader sounds simple, but in actuality, it is hard to get. If the democratic plumbers do not eliminate democracy and freedom, the debt will.

How much debt can be tolerated as a fraction of GDP? The debt becomes unsustainable when it grows to twice the GDP<sup>95</sup>, but the interest payments on such a high number is like stealing from the poor. In a healthy country with legitimate social programs, there should be no debt. Having no operating deficit should be a given, but in monetarily unhealthy countries, servicing a large debt makes a zero deficit difficult. Instead, there is enormous debt, not just at the federal level, but also at the provincial, the regional, the municipal and the personal levels. All hail to the creditors! They will truly be the new Caesar, the ruler not the salad. Nobody will afford Caesar salad. It is time to leave.

# 5.8 A Safety Net or a Fish Net

In any society, the people who are failed by the system must not be ignored. They must be helped, otherwise if there are enough of them, they will want to tear the system down. The BO realized it is important to help the poor, but he did not use it as an excuse to increase the bureaucracy. He also realized the importance of the union of a man and a woman and their resulting children. The family unit is quite important to stamp out poverty. A family would be extremely embarrassed if they had a member become homeless.

The revolutions which formed Vesputia were fueled by people ignored by corrupt politicians who loved pointless wars, increasing the bureaucracy and padding their own pockets. The people of the MT Territories were doomed because they did not recognize when a leader hated them. Politicians are an odious breed.

The people at the bottom cannot be ignored and should be given the opportunity to retrain. Otherwise, resentment, jealousy and hatred fester leading eventually to democratic plumbing. Helping the poor is important especially in the CU, but the Benevolent One does it with small government.

The BO makes it easier to help the poor by making as many people as possible prosperous with a vibrant and large middle class. There were almost no regulations, just a set of commonsense laws. There were many jobs including part-time jobs. In the CU, there were not many people in government jobs (at the public trough), but the private sector, when left alone by the goobernment, readily filled the void.

Charitable organizations, such as churches, were prolific and not controlled by the dumbernment. When the average citizen is well off, they tend to be more generous than in a democratic plumbing society with high inflation and high gas prices which make everybody poor and unhappy. Happy and prosperous people want a pristine environment free from garbage and homeless encampments.

The poor were never left to starve and always had some form of roof over their heads in retraining zones. Substance abuse was treated as a mental illness and not allowed in these zones. Substance abuse begets substance abuse. If only government were treated like the substance abuse or the mental illness it really is, then there would be more places to live like the CU. Poverty was attacked by targeting addictions and providing opportunities. There is an old saying that if a person is given a fish, he eats for the day, but if he is taught to fish or given a fish net, he eats for life.

Poverty is also reduced by making everything cheaper including Caesar salad dressing. The poor may never have a Caesar salad in a fancy restaurant but they can have one at home if they really think they are missing something.

# 5.9 Smarmy Oil

Oil is great. It provides cheap energy which helps people out of poverty. Oil is also used to make so many different products such as clothing, fertilizers, plastics and many more things. Burning fuel from oil also eliminates the respiratory problems of burning wood and dung to cook food.

Fossil fuels are such a benefit to humanity that one starts to wonder if the left, which opposes them, is just antihuman. Is this something to do with the movement to depopulate the Earth? Also not liking nuclear power suggests the affirmative. Nuclear energy can significantly increase the life of the current supply of oil.

# 6. Freeducation

# **6.1 Education or Ideological Training?**

In the MT Territories, education, like the debt, was ignored. The students learned that the system of Western civilization is evil and that democratic plumbing is not only compassionate but, if done properly, leads to utopia.

The people who worked hard all their life were outraged because if it were not for the evil overs, they could have taken it easy and been paid by the government to do nothing. Contributing to society, just like the debt, could have been someone else's problem.

Democratic plumbers believe that free market capitalism exists only to make a few rich, and the equal application of poverty is better. However, without the creation of wealth by free market capitalism, the government eventually fails like all Ponzi schemes.

It is all nice that government is kept small and costs to companies are low, but if the country has a lousy education system, the experiment called a country can still be a failure. All companies are prepared for some training of their employees, but prefer to hire highly skilled workers who are keen to learn. Employers prefer that their new hires are a product of a good education system. Education sets a student up for a good job, but it also sets a company with a good employee.

In the MT Territories, an enterprising academic may think about running a business to tutor the slower students to get them at their proper math level. The education system must be able to pick up students who are left behind. Sounds simple. All a person has to do is to read the curriculum and make a textbook for Amazon Kindle called, "Bring your child up to speed in Math." This can be done in any subject the entrepreneur enjoys.

However, the task is not that simple. The curriculum for Math in the MT Territories is written down in words satisfying the DEI (diversity, equity or equality of outcome not opportunity, and inclusion) agenda. It is complete and utter gobbledygook which sets up students for failure. Such a system will not respect standardized tests because

they will show how much a failure the teachers really are compared to countries who do not mess with a child's education for the sake of politics.

The curriculum and learning schedule (including exams) were readily available to the public in the CU unlike Vesputia. The goal of education in the MT Territories was to keep the masses uneducated and compliant. The motto was "Nobody is left behind" which really meant that nobody could advance. The sad reality was that the teachers (not komissars) were so poor themselves, they could not handle or challenge an advanced student, but were always happy to take credit for the student's natural brilliance. The key to a proper education system is to provide competition and reduce the effect of the teacher's conflict of interest. Teachers are strongly in favor of unions and that comes clearly across in teaching kids that companies lead to fascism in addition to the lie that socialism and big government are good. Furthermore, the students are taught that unions are good, but unions add another layer of bureaucracy and effectively reduce the workers' pay. Unions are not altruistic. Someone pays for them. Most students certainly cheer for the teachers during strikes, not realizing the teachers are effectively striking against their parents who foot the bill in their taxes.

There should be school choice and funding choice which means the parents choose the school, and the taxpayers decide which school gets their taxes. The poor schools teaching ideology will fail because of low attendance. Those schools where education is fun and fulfilling will have full classrooms.

Most people realize the importance of education, but some come to this conclusion too late in a child's schooling after years of low marks. Those people are willing to incur huge student debt in order to get a higher education. This is so wrong even though education is the best road out of poverty, but debt is not. Incurring a debt delays the ability to support a family and buy a home.

A lot of the learning facilitated by a higher education could have been done when it was free in grade school and certainly could be done later in life with a library card.

The blasé attitude to debt at all levels from the individual to the government is just wrong.

The best education system is one which allows a student to learn on his own and contest exams, courses and years of Uboca. If a student contests a course and succeeds, he saves money and time and does not incur a high debt. If he fails to get 80%, he simply takes the course.

A leader of any country never ignores education, but for the good of the student, he probably should. The more government gets involved, the more centrally planned something becomes and the worse the result.

Education serves to raise the human spirit, but it also promotes the love of country and leads to employment. It should not simply be a tool to step through hoops just to get a good job. Education should be based on a love for knowledge, both by the komissars who share the knowledge and by the students who lap it up. It is only natural that if somebody loves doing something, they will love teaching it to share the pleasure they get from the activity.

Education also leads to a good sense of community and even to a good hobby. If the hobby is done well enough, it may lead to employment from the hobby itself or from teaching the hobby. Employment is just an added bonus because exercising the brain is just as important as exercising the body, and both are fun and absolutely necessary.

In a healthy country, the students must be taught, the Lord's Prayer, the National Anthem and God Save the King (Charles III). God, King and country must be part of the daily routine. In the Carolean<sup>100</sup> (not Chuckian) era and the subsequent Gulielean Era<sup>101</sup> (William V), children must be taught to love their country and her history. They must appreciate how good Christian values and western civilization

really are. Good things took years to develop. They must think for themselves and not be taken in by propaganda.

Students must be thankful for prosperity, education and leisure activities. They must be taught that they cannot take education for granted and that work and leisure must be balanced. The best education system is one that does not limit any student and produces what most dictators hate above all, independent thinkers.

The best way to ruin an education system is to pay attention to an outcry against leaving poor students behind. Denying poor students a higher education later in life seems like too harsh a punishment. However, overturning the meritocracy punishes the good students as well and makes the education system poor for everybody.

The bureaucrats with dumb kids (like father like son or like mother like daughter) do not want them to miss out on high paying jobs which come with a good education. That natural parental instinct is not surprising, but it is wrong. First of all, the assumption that a university education is better than the trades is just dead wrong because it depends on the student.

If a person is a poor student in grade school, he always should be given the opportunity to turn things around later in life when he gets his act together. Any system should allow a person to work hard, contest exams, attend night school and get a higher education if he merits it. Having a system that does not leave anybody behind just makes it a poor system for everybody even the good students.

Does a student need to learn that the Ural River forms the border between Europe and Asia or that Turkey spans two continents? Probably not, but a geography course would be remiss if this was not mentioned. However a person travelling to Russia and Turkey should do a little research before the trip.

Somebody could become an artist or a journalist after being a Math and Science whizz (whiz is also correct for those who do not like ZZ Top or Texan blues) in school. It would be nice that high school give a broader education, but at the very least it should give students the tools and desire to learn on their own. Education does not end when school ends, it's just harder to be wrong. A person who can admit

to being wrong is open to learning even outside of school. Such a person can overcome propaganda when faced with the facts. That is impossible with ideological training and a refusal to admit being wrong.

# **6.2** Stepping Stone Out of Poverty

There are many countries where a good education is not readily available, so the poor are trapped in poverty. Under Dictator Suharto (1967 to 1998<sup>102</sup>), Indonesian children only got a half day of education because there were too many students for the resources provided such as schoolrooms and desks. Half of the students went to school in the morning and the other half went in the afternoon. They were taught to love their country and its dictator, but they were not taught to think independently and not realize they could be better off. The internet came along and may have changed people's perception, but education rift with propaganda can still be a trap. Employers know how good or how poor the school system is. They flock to the CU because the education system is a full day and is so good.

In other poor countries like Bolivia and Peru, for example, students cannot afford a free education provided by the government. Yes, that statement is correct. They cannot afford free education. If the parents beg in the streets to feed their families, the tourists brush them aside, and their begging is not that effective.

However, if their children beg, the tourists are shocked and are saddened at the sight of these destitute kids who, in the words of the tourists, "should be in school." Every kid should be able to enjoy a Western-style childhood. The emotions evoked loosen and spring open up the purse strings. The money, the urchins earn, make it impossible for the parents to allow them to go to school. What ends up happening is that good-intentioned tourists who support begging are robbing the kids of an education which is the only path of success they have. The tourists who give a poor kid candy never give him an accompanying voucher for dental work but feel good for being nice.

That sounds familiar. Leaders who give out free money by ignoring the debt may be good intentioned, but they really are not. It is also not free money. The cost is just deferred. Future generations are being robbed of prosperity. The BO does not ignore the debt. He pays it off and does not increase it one little bit. He could never trust that the creditors would have the fones' best interest at heart. The BO also realizes

there is no free lunch. He cannot pay the salaries of government employees strictly through taxation.

The electorate is always happy with free money, but everybody would be better off with no debt and a free market education system. The opportunities which come with an unfettered education system (Freeducation with school and funding choice and contestable exams) is the real free money and the true road out of poverty.

#### 6.3 Two Streams

When it came to water, there were many streams in the CU. However, when it came to education or freeducation, there were only two, the academic (university) and the trades (vocation). The CU knew education was the key to prosperity, but having one stream, like in the MT Territories, would cause boredom in students not interested in the academics.

How often have you heard a cabinet maker or a heavy duty mechanic say, "My life would only be complete if I knew Pi  $(\pi)$  to ten decimal places?" 3.141592653589. There are twelve, so it is really complete. It is hard imagine living a fulfilled life without knowing  $\pi^4 + \pi^5 = e^6$ . That fun "fact" came from Facebook<sup>103</sup>. The equal sign is not accurate like it would be for rational numbers. An academic person may have fun with that statement, but would be lost fixing a leaky faucet. Some people are just suited to a trade, just like some are suited to the academics. Students were allowed to choose the stream they or their parents wanted.

Sam and his sisters were on the academic track of the class system. Every day they passed below the entrance sign above the main door which boldly displayed the CUs words, "Through knowledge, happiness will be found." It did not say how much knowledge and how much happiness. That depended on the individual. The CU was a land of equal opportunity but certainly not a land of evil equal outcomes.

Nearby, there was the class system for the trades. The sign there said, "Through skill, happiness will be found." Those students only had to endure at most one hour a day combined of math, English, and history. They were taught to read, do their taxes, and love their country. It should seem odd that patriotism was not a given. Classes on patriotism were a holdover from the past because getting rid of a class on patriotism seemed unpatriotic. An easy course gave confidence to the students of the non-academic stream.

The rest of the day was spent in the shops, music halls, sports facilities, the kitchens and the sewing rooms. There were drafting and computer rooms as well. Students often learned to code because they wanted to make computer games that were lucrative in foreign countries. They were not told to code because the coal mines were shut down. That would not happen because energy was recognized as being of an utmost importance. With so many trades possible, it was a crime for a student to look where the clock should have been for a good portion of the day because he was in the wrong class system.

The trades stream went to Grade 11. Students were allowed to challenge the final exams and leave school earlier to work as an apprentice. That could be any age the qualifications were attained. Even if a student left as early as Grade 8, he would come back for graduation week and share in the festivities with the students of his same age graduating from the academic stream at the end of Grade 12. Spouses and kids would also be welcome. A good education should include knowing what a student is missing out on. That sentence just ended with two prepositions, but even one preposition is no longer an offense except in Latin<sup>104</sup>.

Students were not encouraged to get more learning by the komissars because of a conflict of interest. Komissars were there for the students not for their own job security. If they were any good, job security came automatically.

Not only that, but the trades were also highly respected and considered more important than many degrees. Plumbers did not need to be philosopher plumbers.

All diplomas and degrees were given with or without honours as well as with or without integrity. Any student, who, on two occasions, was caught floating or copying, even just an assignment, was given the diploma or degree without integrity. The honours distinction meant that a high mark and integrity had been maintained throughout the studies.

A student in the MT Territories could copy his way to a degree. He was only fooling himself. He would not get hired if he did not learn his degree. If he did get hired, then why was the degree so long? Obviously, what he did not learn is not really needed if that was actually the case. Students should be allowed to contest exams and years and get a family sooner rather than later.

However, a copier and a floater probably will take an extra year and pay more tuition fees. Professors have a conflict in interest. They will never tell a student he should be in the trades because they want the tuition fees. They can tell which students will have a useless degree and will be entering the trades after Uboca (four and five years late with student loans), but will get into trouble for warning the students.

A professor telling a student he should be in a trade and not delay family life with a huge student debt will not make his boss happy. His boss wants those years of tuition fees which includes a bonus year if the student is so poor that he takes an extra year. His boss cannot look bad for firing a professor who has the student's back, but he will latch on to any other excuse he can to get rid of that professor, hypothetically of course. Do professors have the student's back? Officially yes, but unofficially that is not where their wallet is.

Are student loans bad? That depends on the student and the ability of the student to pay back the loan once he gets his degree. An engineer, doctor or lawyer, if he likes his job and stays with it, will be able to pay back a student loan fairly easily. However, that money may be better spent on a family and a house, but at least he got a good degree and a high paying job.

Is that fair for the art student who will likely be working for a minimum wage after his degree? Life is not fair. People pay for bad decisions all the time. Sometimes, students pay for bad decisions because their professors want students for their own wage. The one thing for certain is that the university should be on the hook for all student loans if the student declares bankruptcy or has a low paying job after the degree. Student loans should have a time limit before the university must pay.

Sam loved the academic classes. He did so well that nobody would believe otherwise. Students were attentive in the class system because of interest, not fear.

He often worked as a tutor after the class system. Some kids really needed his help because they would get lost and drop further behind. Sam assessed what basics they were missing and helped them catch up (ketchup, but hold the mouse turd or misclick), so they could understand what currently was being taught. He unequivocally refused to do their homework but gave them the tools so that they could do it on their own.

Some parents could not admit, their son or daughter was simply better in the trades. They had a dream their kids would go to the Uboca they could not. Family made university possible, but university should not make family impossible. Family is important. If professors were as wise as they profess, they would teach that.

Everything including the answers in Uboca was by word of mouth from wise sages. Traditions and history were passed from one generation to the next in this fashion. Ubocas were created in that spirit. A good Uboca would never dream of killing the tradition of family.

Parents' dreams gave Sam work, so he did not care. Sam could see that some students were just not for the academics, so he often said to himself, "Je m'en fiche" or "Ça m'est égal." Repetition meant he really did not care. The second expression was better because it sounded mathematical.

A lot of students got good employment and did not need the further education of Uboca. The academic students pursued advanced education unless better offers came along. U is for university and boca is Spanish for mouth. The Ubocas of the past often made the students angry and hate themselves and their country. They became bitter mouthy citizens. Many students were also saddled with crippling (family preventing) debt. The only debt that should exist was a deficit of sunlight in shadows (DoS). If Windows is that much better than DOS, then why are so many updates and versions needed?

There were only two tracks, the academics, and the trades. What if a student failed both tracks? In the past, a failed student could become a politician or a civil servant. James Bond 007 was a civil servant. Was he a failed student? That is not important.

However, the Benevolent One only wanted qualified people to handle his subjects' hard-earned money that was collected as taxes.

A student who failed both tracks could still find a job cleaning toilets and work hard to get promotions. A hard worker was still a value to the community and instilled a good work ethic in his children. The BO did not reward him by setting a minimum wage because he was against visible handcuffs (regulations which make the invisible hand visible and ineffective) on the invisible hand, but the BO kept costs low. That is an effective raise. A rise in tide raises all ships because a society, better off as a whole, raises the bottom rung. Artists are starving if they are any good, but their sales are also better with limited goobernment. People are less likely to donate to charity or to buy luxury items when the government constantly has a hand in their pockets.

Western kids having to work is actually not a bad thing. They learn the value of hard work and money, and they learn to not expect everything to be handed to them. They understand that debts must be paid back. They see firsthand how education opens the door to higher paying jobs which are not coffee-break jobs.

Getting and supporting a family is really important, but university may cause someone to lose sight of that. There is nothing wrong with having a trade, a family and a library card to learn something about philosophy and the Arts.

Once the youth expect everything to be handed to them, they will end up throwing tomato soup on paintings in National galleries to protest oil<sup>105</sup>. Protests like that illustrate how soft people have become and how poor the education system really is. "Hard men make good times, good times make soft men, and soft men make bad times<sup>106</sup>."

"Nobody is left behind" means nobody gets ahead even with hard work. Without hard work, nobody pushes the final frontier of the mind. The mind stagnates.

An education system which has the motto "Nobody is left behind" is likely too ideological and too poor. People may have had good intentions with that motto, but there has been enough time to see there is a need for something better such as "Nobody is bored and learning is not limited." That may be the main difference between education and freeducation. Education should be free from indoctrination and propaganda. The climate hoax scares children, but the adults should be scared by indoctrinated bored children. # 6.4 Promotion and Relegation
