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What is the key play to each of the following?

Board 1 Cross Ruff

- Do not touch trump
- Cash all necessary side-suit winners

North Dealer None Vulnerable

Count the Tricks.

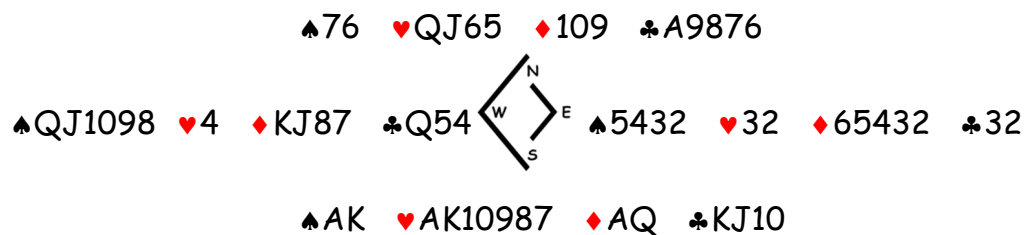
- Eight ruffs
- Two red Aces
- Three ♣'s

Because declarer is only in six, only two ♣'s must be cashed. If three clubs are cashed, East will ruff and lead trump and declarer will be down one. The clubs must be cashed before carrying out the cross-ruff because when the defenders cannot overruff, they will pitch clubs.

Board 2 End Play

- Eliminate all the defender's safe exit cards
- Throw a defender in.
- They will lead a suit that helps declarer.

East Dealer North South Vulnerable

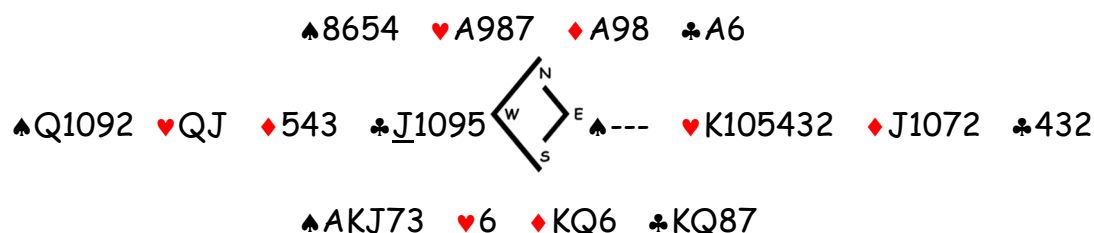
Declarer must draw trump, cash spades, cash the ♦A and throw the opponents in with the ♦Q. West will either play a club or give a sluff and a ruff. If declarer

takes the diamond finesse. They have a 50% chance of finding the ♣Q and making the slam. Using the end play gives the slam a 100% chance.

Board 3 Trump End Play

- Eliminate all the defender's safe exit cards.
- Shorten the long-hand trump to the same length as the defender's trump.
- Throw a defender in.

South Dealer East West Vulnerable



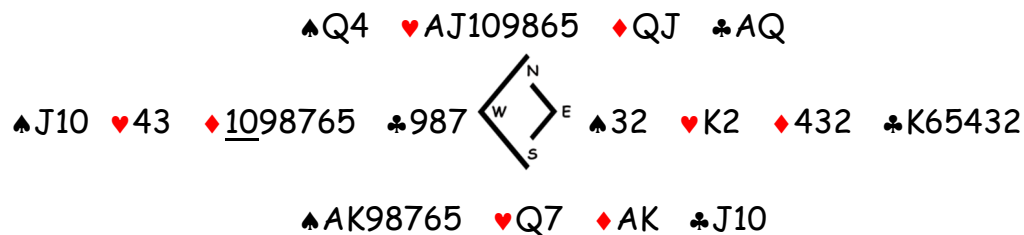

Declarer wins the ♣A and plays a trump to the ♠A. He then ruffs a heart to shorten his trump to the same length of West's trump, cashes his diamonds and ruffs a club. He then plays the ♠8 and West is endplayed in trump.

Board 4 Squeeze

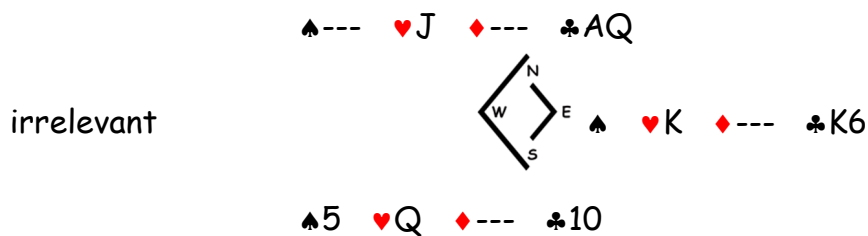
- Rectify the count by losing every single loser he can lose to make the contract.
- Declarer runs long suit and watches the discards.
- A defender must be guarding two suits and must surrender one guard.

West Dealer Both Vulnerable

Declarer cashes his top diamonds and the ♥A and then runs his spades. The hands look like the following.

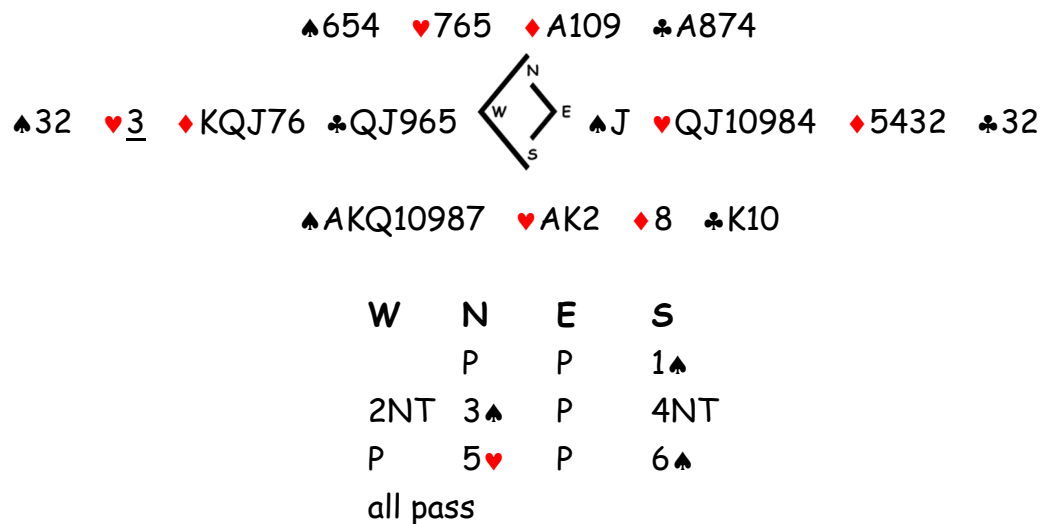


Declarer cashes the ♠5 and pitches the ♥Jack. East must let go a card and declarer makes 7NT doubled.

Board 5 Trump Squeeze

- Run trump, watch discards and ruff a suit good.
- The defender ahead of dummy must be protecting the suits.

North Dealer NS Vulnerable



Declarer wins the ♥Ace, draws trump and cashes his other top heart and runs his spades. The hands look like the following.



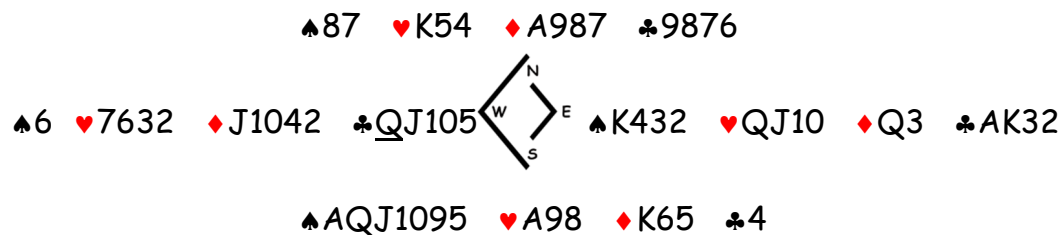
Declarer cashes the ♠9 and pitches the suit that West keeps. Declarer cashes the Ace and ruffs a card in the suit West discards. Let's say West discards the ♦King. Declarer discards a club and ruffs a diamond good. He makes +1460.

Board 6 Trump Coup

- The finesse works but dummy does not have enough cards to take the finesse enough in the trump suit.
- The long-trump hand must be shortened to the same length as the player with the long trump.

East Dealer

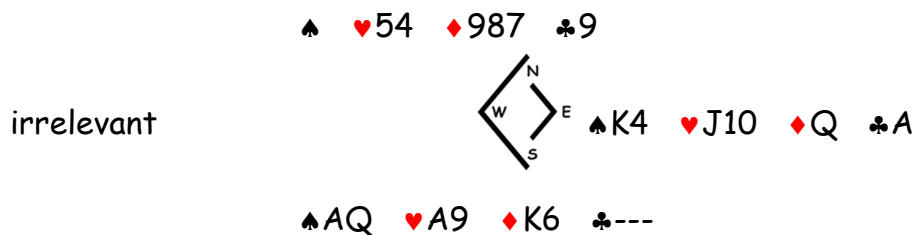
East West Vulnerable

Declarer ruffs the second club continuation of the opening lead with the ♠10. He then plays a heart to the ♥K. He runs the ♠8 through and then the ♠7 to the ♠9. He gets the bad news and goes to the ♦Ace to ruff another club. Now his trump are the same length as East's.

The hands look like the following.



Declarer cashes the ♦King and the ♥Ace and loses the lead. The opponents will give declarer his last spade finesse. Declarer makes +420.
