Trump Leads

- o When in doubt
- You have a stiff trump
- You have Qxx in trump
- You want a ruff
- You cannot stop declarer from his short hand ruffs
 - Declarer is 4-4 or 5-4
- You have four or more trump
 - Lead a suit that will make declarer ruff in the long trump hand.

Forcing Defense

You are on lead against 45 with the following, what do you lead?


♦: K543 **♥**:8 **♦**:A65 **♣**:KQJ109

Answer:

♣ King.

The whole hand:

North Dealer None Vulnerable



Stiff leads help declarer sometimes!

It makes on a heart lead but will go down on a club lead if not played carefully.

Win A* and play a small diamond to the Queen and a heart to the ace. A diamond to the Jack and if west wins Ace. He will play two clubs. Ruff a club and with clubs still in dummy, play *Queen. Ruff a club in dummy and then draw trump. You can only ruff in the long trump hand once in case trump are 4-1. If they are 5-0, you are down.

If you draw trump before knocking out the Diamond ace, you will be down, losing 3.5, 2.5 and one 4.
